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Evaluation of training days for residents in family medicine

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Background :

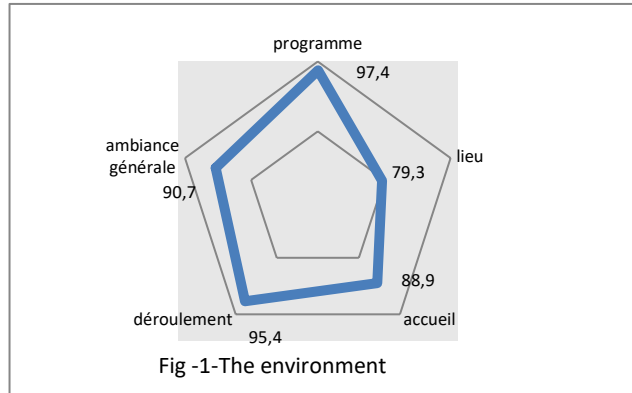
In order to serve our community, the faculty of medicine aim to provide good quality training for their family medicine residents. Are the family residents satisfied with the training days ? In this framework, this study aimed to describe the satisfaction of family medicine residents with the training days .

Methods:

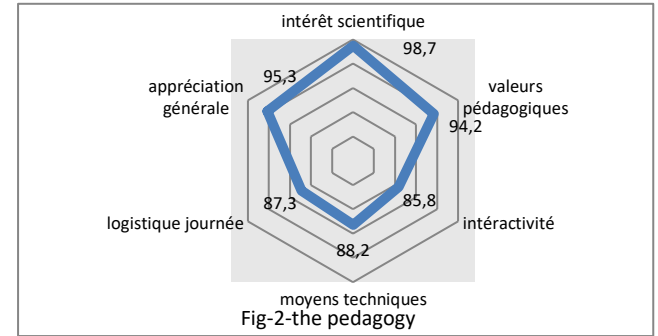
We conducted a descriptive cross-sectional study, describing the satisfaction of family residents for training days done in the faculty of medicine in Monastir, Tunisia. during the year of 2018 and 2019. A questionnaire was prepared and delivered to residents at the end of each training session. Three core areas were assessed in this descriptive study: the environment, the pedagogy and the output. Data analysis was performed using the Statistical Package for Social Sciences (SPSS) version 21.0. The curves were constructed by the Excel software.

Results:

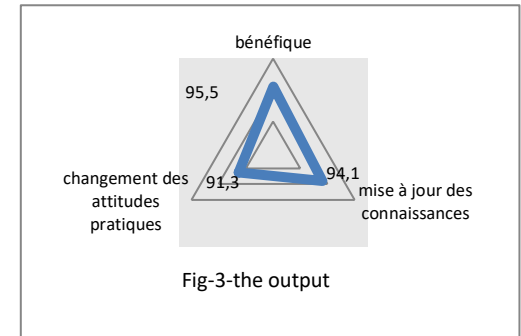
In total of 156 family residents who completed the training days ; 97.4% were satisfied for the program, 79.3% for the place .(figure 1)



The evaluation was satisfying for the scientific interest 98.7. (figure 2)



For the comment section, we noticed that the most important comments were to have more interactive formations and to have more simulation sessions. Output 95.9% voted for receiving a gain. (figure 3)



Conclusion:

The results in this study showed the success of training days in pedagogy, general study conditions and residents' output. More than 70% of the family residents were interested in the most of the subjects presented.
